## Assignments

- 1. Write a description of the small group of experts that will advise the Situations Project. Who should attend? What will they do or produce? Why convene such a group? (Kathy Heid)

- 2. What is NSF trying to accomplish with the Dear Colleague Letter? Compile information from the Dear Colleague letter, telephone conversation with Spud and Janice, information from Bob Reys. (Pat Wilson)
- 3. Collect evidence that disparate groups (small) are looking at mathematical knowledge for teaching at the secondary level and need to be brought together. Look at conference proceedings, meetings, known projects. (Brad Findell and Rose Zbeik, Eileen Murray)

  - AMTE monograph on developing content knowledge.
